Dreamers Costume List



In Joseph, the Dreamers will be wearing their own clothing in the colors of the Dreamcoat (scarlet, royal blue, fuchsia, orange, kelly green, purple, canary yellow). Please see the picture attached for reference. Be colorful! While there is black and white in the coat, please try to avoid wearing large amounts of black or white. You may also mix and match colors as long as your tops and bottoms don't clash.

What to wear:

Almost anything you might wear to June camp. Some ideas for boys would be T-shirts or short-sleeved button up shirts with shorts or pants. Girls may wear T-shirts or blouses with shorts, skirts, colored (non-blue) jeans, or dresses (you may also layer bottoms and dresses with leggings). Please be sure that your clothes are appropriate for the dancing and movement you are required to do during the show.

Please no sweatpants, sweatshirts, pajamas, short shorts, miniskirts, bathing suits, clothing with holes in it, or blue jeans.

Do not wear anything with words, logos, or large images written or printed on it. You can wear items with patterns like stripes, polka dots, plaids, etc., but please be sure that your top and bottoms match and aren't too distracting.

On your feet: Sneakers with socks OR jazz shoes.

Hats: please do not wear hats, caps, or visors.

Belts, scarves, and ribbon can be worn at the waist. Do not wear flashy buckles that will catch the light and distract or blind the audience.

Some jewelry can be worn, but please do not wear anything too shiny or large that might distract the audience.

Hair: Please keep in mind that we want to see your beautiful faces so hair should be worn off the face and make-up should be simple. Please provide your own brush, bobby pins, hairspray, make-up, sponges, etc. for the show. **Girls** can wear any variation of an up-do or use barrettes, headbands, scarves or ribbons to pull back the front sections of their hair.

Make-up: Girls may wear make-up as long as it is pretty and enhances natural features. Please no overly dramatic applications.

Boys: Make sure your hair is brushed and not falling into your face.

Deadline: On the morning of the 19th, I will be looking at the costumes you've come up with and will make comments and/or changes. You **MUST** bring ALL of your costume pieces that day on a hanger labeled with your name. Accessories can be kept in a bag with your name on it. We will check your costumes in and keep them at the theatre through June 24th. After strike on the 24th, you will bring home everything that belongs to you. Any costume pieces that belong to Kids Who Care need to be turned in at strike.
